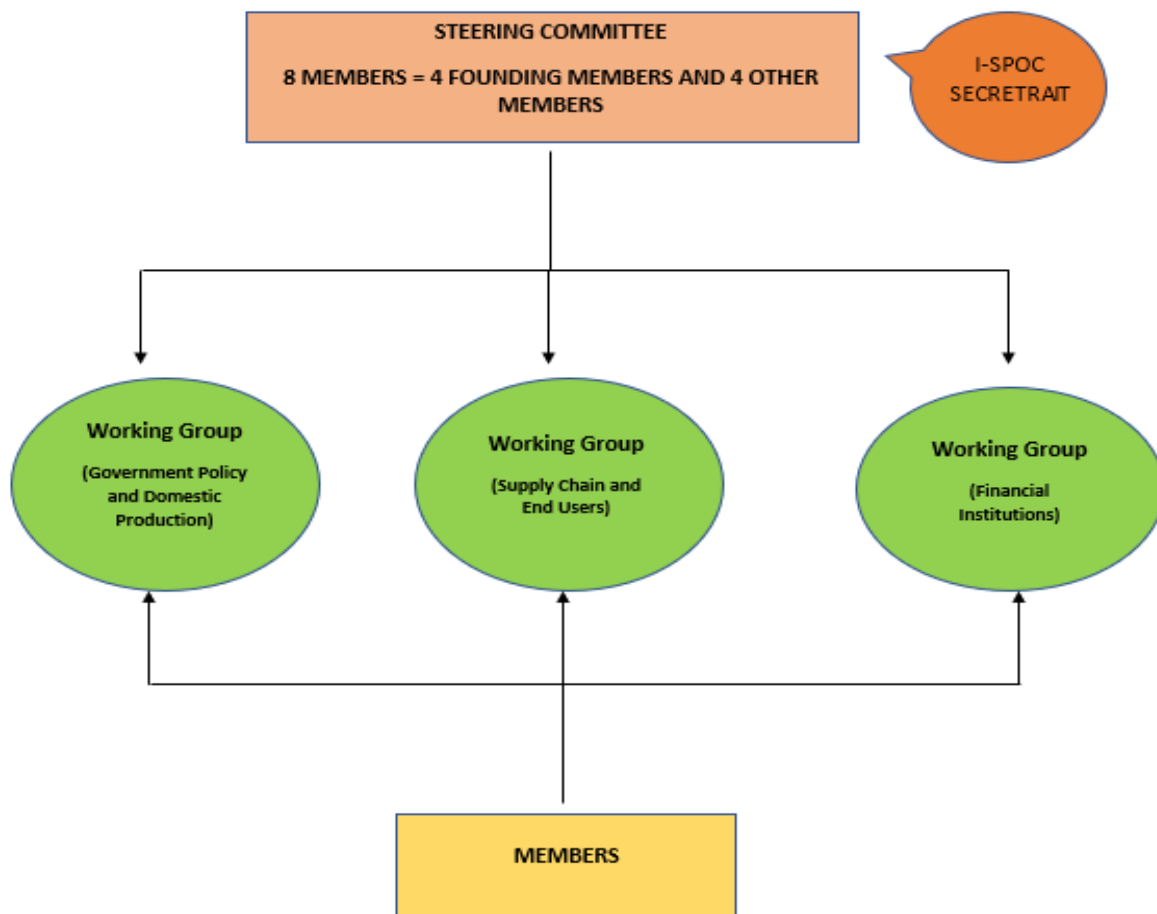
1. Introduction

The Sustainable Palm Oil Coalition for India (I-SPOC) was formed to promote the uptake of sustainable palm oil in India, with the Goal to ***promote sustainable consumption and trade of palm oil and its derivatives in India along the supply chain, through industry collaboration.***

This Coalition was conceived by four (founding) organisations – Centre for Responsible Business (CRB), World Wide Fund for Nature India (WWF-India), Roundtable for Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO) and Rainforest Alliance (RA) and launched in September 2018.

This Constitution provides an idea of the Governance Structure of the Coalition together with the Roles and Responsibilities of the various actors of this Coalition.

2. Structure and Actors of the Coalition

2.1 Steering Committee (SC)

- The SC would be comprising of the following
 - i. 4 Founding Members
 - ii. 4 representatives from the industry (
- The 4 representatives from the industry will be selected for a period of 3 years. Members can remain in the SC for a maximum period of two terms.
- Eligibility Criteria for SC Members:
 - i. Working in the Palm Oil supply Chain
 - ii. Committed to the Goal of I-SPOC (promote sustainable consumption and trade of palm oil and its derivatives in India along the supply chain)
 - iii. An institutional commitment (Policy/Strategy) on Sustainability/Sustainable Sourcing/SDGs
 - iv. Uphold the principle of 'shared responsibility'
- The SC Members would be expected to reach out to potential Members to socialize the Coalition and its goal

2.2 Working Groups (WGs)

- The permanent members will nominate themselves to either of the three working groups
- The WG Members would include industry actors, NGOs and industry bodies – all with relevant experience to strengthen and contribute to the activities of the coalition

2.3 Members

- There will be two types of members; Permanent and Affiliated
- Permanent members will have the following rights
 - Participation in I-SPOC Members Meeting
 - Participation for all I-SPOC meetings (external meetings/seminars/sessions/workshops) that will be organized at relevant events
 - Opportunities to collaborate with other players in the network
 - Branding/visibility (logo) on I-SPOC website
 - Become part of a Working Group
- Affiliate member will have the following rights
 - Participation in I-SPOC Members Meeting
 - Complementary participation for all I-SPOC meetings (external meetings/seminars/sessions/workshops) that will be organized at relevant events
 - Opportunities to collaborate with other players in the network
 - Branding/visibility (logo) on I-SPOC website
- Members should be committed to the Goal of I-SPOC (**promote sustainable consumption and trade of palm oil and its derivatives in India along the supply chain**)

- Members would actively participate in all activities of the Coalition, and nominate a relevant a Staff for the same
- Members would allow the Coalition to display their logos on the Coalition website and other relevant communication material
- Members to act as Ambassadors in their own networks to promote the goals and objectives of I-SPOC

2.4 Observers

Steering Committee or Permanent members could invite relevant stakeholders as 'observers' to I-SPOC events and meeting

2.5 Secretariat

CRB will be responsible for hosting the Secretariat of the Coalition

3. Roles & Responsibilities

<p>Working Group Supply Chain and End Users</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Guide the Steering Committee on necessary actions to mobilise supply chain actor companies in support of sustainable palm oil ● Identify vendors/actors in the existing supply chain ● Participate and facilitate periodic training/capacity building workshops for the domestic vendors to promote the uptake of sustainable palm oil ● Organize training/capacity building workshop for their own company ● Bring important issues pertaining to Supply Chain and End Users Actors to the cognizance of the Steering Committee ● Exchange of existing knowledge and good practices pertaining to promoting traceability and accountability-based disclosures along the supply chain ● Develop knowledge products related to supply chain and end users that can be used by relevant stakeholders in their journey towards sustainability and

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Support and facilitate awareness generation activities of relevant actors to understand the risks related to non-sustainably sourced palm oil (lack of or low transparency or traceability) linked to their investments/portfolio ● Work with actors from FIs (Banks & NBFC) to understand the linkage between sustainable palm oil and the broader commitments they may have, e.g. deforestation, biodiversity loss, climate change ● Develop tools and provide expertise (subject-matter experts) to help these actors better understand and manage these (above) risks ● Develop institutional strategies and operations (e.g. through disclosure, E&S strategies, governance and accountability measures) for better management of this risk
